March Guest Speaker: Kody Chamberlain

Mr. Chamberlain's presentation is called "Getting Past the Gatekeepers" Kody Chamberlain is a professional writer and story artist with over twenty years of experience in comics, film, and television. As both writer and artist, Kody has worked with the best publishers in comics including DC Comics, Dark Horse, HALO/343, HarperCollins, IDW Publishing, Image Comics, Marvel Comics, and Mulholland Books. His original scripts and television pilots have placed at both Sundance and Austin Film Festivals, and his original work has been optioned for development by Universal, MTV, and FOX. Kody has also worked extensively as a concept artist and story artist with credits at Sony, MTV, NBCUniversal, and Warner Bros. He currently lives in Vermilion Parish with his wife Kristie and their son Lucas, and he teaches a drawing and cartooning class for kids once a week.

April Guest Speaker: Joe Abraham, M.D.

Normally we would have 'Members Read' night in April, but we have the chance to hear from Dr. Joe Abraham, M.D. on writing and on Booktown. Joseph N Abraham MD is an emergency physician (Tulane '86), evolutionary biologist, & Viet Nam veteran of the US Navy. As a widely-ranging reader and an inveterate traveler, he draws on diverse backgrounds in science, language, art, and history to offer a new perspective on civilization and the human condition in his most recent book, *Kings, Conquerors*,

Psychopaths: From Alexander to Hitler to the Corporation. The book has won over a dozen awards, and is under review by over thirty scholastic journals.

LOOKING AHEAD: May

Our May meeting is "Members read" month. Members may bring work that they have created and share with the attendees. It may be a work in progress or a completed work. Five minutes will be allotted for each reader. Singers and songwriters within the organization are invited to share their work as a cappella or acoustic numbers; however, there is a limit of one song per performer and the song must also be no longer than five minutes.

May Prompt: "Thursday's Menu"

Category: Fiction

This is a fun competition for members. The prompt MUST APPEAR somewhere within the work, and entries must be no longer than 500 words. The author must be present, but may allow another to read the piece aloud. All entries must be typed and double-spaced. The story must have the word count, title, author's name, and date of the competition written at the top of the first page, and a paper copy of the **winner** and **runner-up** is to be handed in to the vice-president after the judging. Contest participants are not allowed to enter the contest with works that are typed on iPhones or any other electronic devices.

Winners of the competition will be published in a booklet

A Creative Writing Competition Winners booklet will be printed containing all the winners of the bi-monthly writing competition.

John François, a WGA past president and current WGA Board Member, has just published his seventh novel, TO THE YELLOWSTONE COUNTRY. It is the final book of his trilogy (following CARRIER OF BONES and PONTIAC). The journey of the fifteen-year-old protagonist begins at Pointe Coupée, Lousiana, in 1761 when he is forced to return with his father to Acadie (Carrier-of-Bones) present day New Brunswick and Nova Scotia) to reinter the bones of his mother and little brother in the old family cemetery. Unable to return to Louisiana, he is caught up in the final throes of the French and Indian War and adopted by a Seneca family. After many deadly escapades in a savage country (Pontiac), he ends up at the age of twenty-four trapping in the fur-rich Yellowstone country where his trials continue (To the Yellowstone Country).

François is self-published and was a finalist in the Annual Writers Network Screenplay and Fiction Competition for his Carrier-of-Bones, as well as in the Writers Digest Competition, and in the Global E-Books Awards Competition www.johnfrancois.com
