April Guest Speaker: Joe Abraham, M.D.

Normally we would have 'Members Read' night in April, but we have the chance to hear from Dr. Joe Abraham, M.D. on writing and on Booktown. Joseph N Abraham MD is an emergency physician (Tulane '86), evolutionary biologist, & Viet Nam veteran of the US Navy. As a widely-ranging reader and an inveterate traveler, he draws on diverse backgrounds in science, language, art, and history to offer a new perspective on civilization and the human condition in his most recent book, *Kings, Conquerors, Psychopaths: From Alexander to Hitler to the Corporation*. The book has won over a dozen awards, and is under review by over thirty scholastic journals.

His topic will be "Creativity, Innovation, & AI: Writing Insights."

LOOKING AHEAD: May

Our May meeting is "Members read" month. Members may bring work that they have created and share with the attendees. It may be a work in progress or a completed work. Five minutes will be allotted for each reader. Singers and songwriters within the organization are invited to share their work as a cappella or acoustic numbers; however, there is a limit of one song per performer and the song must also be no longer than five minutes.

May Prompt: "Thursday's Menu"

Category: Fiction

This is a fun competition for members. Non-members may also read their entries, but won't be eligible for the token prize. The prompt MUST APPEAR somewhere within the work, and entries must be no longer than 500 words. The author must be present, but may allow another to read the piece aloud. All entries must be typed and double-spaced. The story must have the word count, title, author's name, and date of the competition written at the top of the first page, and a paper copy of the **winner** and **runner-up** is to be handed in to the vice-president after the judging. Contest participants are not allowed to enter the contest with works that are typed on iPhones or any other electronic devices.

Winners of the competition will be published in the Anthology

A Creative Writing Competition Winners booklet will be printed containing all the winners of the bi-monthly writing competition.

Looking ahead to June: Guest Speaker Dan Klefstad

Our June meeting will be a remote conference Zoom-type meeting. "Greetings. How often have your members resorted to paid promo services? Have some fallen for scams? My Amazon best-seller, DIY Book Promo: How to Find Readers without Spending Money, teaches authors that devoting a set amount of time for promotion, every day, will help them achieve their sales goals. My book incorporates lessons from the successful campaign for my novel, Fiona's Guardians, including how to co-brand with indie bookstores. I also teach interviewing tips from my 30-year radio career.

I'll be speaking at major conferences this summer and fall, but I actually prefer meeting smaller groups of authors (in person or via Zoom) and taking their questions after I finish my PowerPoint. And, keeping with the spirit of my book, I charge no fee."

Dan Klefstad is a longtime radio host and newscaster. His latest novel, *Fiona's Guardians*, is about humans who work for a beautiful vampire named Fiona. The book was adapted by Artists' Ensemble Theater for their Mysterious Journey podcast. A short film adaptation is currently in pre-production with a release date in 2024.

He now writes in Louisville, Kentucky.
